Prepositions

Prepositions are important tools for creating variety and meaning in description.

They are words used to describe a relationship between two or more things.

They can be:

A spatial relationship (Her bag was <u>under</u> the chair) A time relationship (They arrived <u>on</u> Monday) A manner in which something is done (They went <u>by</u> car)

Prepositions

Prepositions allow the reader to navigate your scene.

They help build connections between the things in the scene.

They develop a 3D impression of your scene in the reader's mind.

Prepositions

They provide you the ability to layer your scene and effectively 'zoom in' on it.

When you use this technique, think of yourself as a camera, moving in closer and closer to the selected object. Said object would need to be important to the scene as a whole.
